Workshop Objectives

- Improve the common understanding of Plant Variety Protection in the region
- Exchange of information on the processes for protection of new varieties of plants
- Identify opportunities for cooperation among National PVP Offices
- Identify opportunities to better communicate the benefits of Plant Breeders Rights

Key Outcomes and Future Steps

To highlight top priorities, participants agreed that following items rank high:



- Technical and policy aspects of using supplementary marker information:
 - Start differentiating soybean varieties
- Development of electronic forms for PVP filing
- Coordinate product naming across the region, with emphasis on soybeans
 - "Variety Denomination"
- Participants recognized the need to hold two F2F meetings in the future:
